★ **1PFC Miguel Ordonez's** last email on 1/10/11: "Hello, it's PFC Ordonez. It has been a while since I emailed but I wanted to say thank you...thank you to all those who helped out in helping soldiers overseas. The Care Packages are very helpful and they come in handy. My battle buddies here always ask how do I get so many Care Packages and I respond by telling them a church sends me around 3 to 4 boxes a month. Then I open the boxes and look inside and people ask is all that for you and I say no...you can take what you want. Before I even have a chance to take it to the normal spot where I leave the boxes, about 75% of the box is gone. Then I put the rest of the items at the usual spot and by the end of the week the rest of it is gone. The Hingham community has helped me and my battle buddies out so much and we all appreciate it."
