"This is Ian's wife, Amy Nadeau. He doesn't get on <a computer> much so he asked me to check his email and respond to you when possible. My husband is actually at Camp Isakle but write Camp Taji on the mailing address. It is a base that just opened back up after 5 years being closed. They have dirty water so when they take showers they get clean but not the greatest of clean. Ian is a medic, and there is about 30 men in his troop. He is constantly working gets about 4 hours of sleep if he is lucky a night. Iraq is a very busy place for my husband, he has saved a lot of lives. He does not believe that he is a hero but to me and many other families he is. Just the other day he took care of a little girl and a little boy, they are doing well and recovering. His day consists of working in the medic station taking care of the sick and injured but mostly the injured. There has been many times that he has had to be rushed away when we were on the phone to go and care for a soldier being flown in by helicopter.

There are no women in his unit, and they do not have a PX at their camp, they have very few amenities where they are. They are just beginning to make them housing and there are few that have electricity at the moment, and do not have Internet in their rooms, like the other camps. Ian was very lucky to get one of the new rooms that were built and he shares it with three other men, which he works, eats and sleeps with these same men...."
